#### Thinking about re-siding your residence? Some ideas from a local expert

Professor Emeritus of Wood Science, resident Michael O. Hunt, knows something about history and wood-and how they can go Michael (whose 5th St. house is together. shown above), recently replaced the siding on his garage with pressure preservative-treated yellow poplar that is water repellent and decay resistant. Used as siding from colonial times, yellow poplar is prized for its workability.
