Thinking about re-siding your residence? Some ideas from a local expert

Professor Emeritus of Wood Science, resident Michael O. Hunt, knows something about history and wood—and how they can go together. Michael (whose 5th St. house is shown above), recently replaced the siding on his garage with pressure preservative-treated yellow poplar that is water repellent and decay resistant. Used as siding from colonial times, yellow poplar is prized for its workability.
