Tunnel Extension Completed



Brad Talley, Superintendent of Water Pollution Control in Lafayette, reports that The Cincinnati Street Conveyance Tunnel Extension has been completed. The tunnel project was part of a 20 year plan with the State of Indiana to reduce the combined sewer overflows in the City of Lafayette, which has greatly reduced the amount of raw sewage entering the Wabash River when it rains.

Be kind: Water your trees

The weather may be hot and dry again this summer, so be kind to your trees! Trees need about 10 gallons of water per inch of trunk diameter. During a drought, trees need to be watered about three times a month. Some symptoms of "drought stress" are wilting leaves, curling leaves, and yellowing leaves. Be proactive—and remember the trees between the sidewalk and the street!





CityBus Transfer Station



Construction is underway at Third and North Streets for a new CityBus Transfer Center. When it is completed there will be specific spots to catch the bus for each route. There will also be a lobby and sheltered spots to wait for transportation. CityBus predicts that construction will be completed by the end of the summer.

North Street Construction

The North Street stormwater project will prevent up to 80% of runoff from entering the sewer system. The bricks are being replaced with porous brick pavers. There is a sinkhole at 10th and Ferry that needs to be repaired, so the intersection will close after June 3. The city is waiting for funding to finish the remaining phase of the project.
